# PREFACE.

WITH the close of the fourth year of publication a second Volume of The Yorkshire Archaelogical and Topographical Journal has been completed. This was the rate of progress contemplated by the Council of the Association when the Journal was commenced, and, while it is a pleasure to have succeeded in this respect, it is no small additional satisfaction to be able to draw attention to the fact, that the Parts have been gradually increased in size, so that the Volume now issued is nearly one-fourth larger than its predecessor.
