



Beston.

- Arms.—1. Beston.—Vert, a lion rampant Argent, crowned Gules.
 - 2. Beston.—Sable, a bend between six cross-crosslets fitché Or.
 - 3. Mereworth.—Argent, a chevron Gules between ten cross-crosslets Sable.
 - 4. Creping.—Gules, a lion rampant Argent, billety Or.



Bellasis.


- "M'dum that on John Bellasys dyd found on Chauntry in the parish church of Our Lady at Durham in the North Barwyke, which Chauntry was of St. Kateren to the which he gave certen lands for the fyndyng of a prest, there to pray for his sole and Alis his wyff and Sibell then his 2 wyff beryng date 22 of Apryll 1419, Thomas then being Boshop of Durram."
- "It apereth by an Indentur interchanged betwene Robert Pryor of Durram & on William de Bellasys that the said Pryor dyd geve unto the said John Hentknoll for Wolveston, dated in September, 1379. Thesse wytnes Raff de Eure and John Coygners Knights, William de Hetton and William de Elmedon & others."



Bellyngham.


